Father Carbajo, OFM has the following degrees SThD, Moral Theology, Alfonsianum, Rome; License degree, Germanic Philology, Santiago de Compostela University Master, Social Communication, Gregorian University, Rome Qualified computer technician (FP, Spain). Born in Zamora, Spain. Father Carbajo, OFM has lived in Rome since 1995, where he teaches ethics and communication at two universities: the Antonianum (Pontifical University Anthonianum or PUA) and the Alfonsianum (Pontifical Lateran University of PUL). AT the PUA, he has serves as Vice-Rector and rector Magnificus ad interim for three years. He also teaches regularly in Spain and the USA. Father Carbajo studies the relevance of the Franciscan Intellectual Tradition in formulating a global ethic and facing the challenges of the new digital age. Also studies journalistic deontology regarding informational privacy. Father Carbajo is currently preparing for the coming academic year at Franciscan School of Theology at Mission San Luis Rey.
