A Secular Age

Religion has withdrawn from the public sphere and Faith has become only one option among many

Process initiated during the Renaissance

Taylor: 3 types of secularization

1. Political: exclusion of God from the public space

2. Sociological: data on religious belief and practice

3. Existential: conditions for the experience of faith and the search for meaning

Immanent vision of reality, common to believers and non-believers

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Two major trends: **1. Immanent humanism 2. Scientism**

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Immanent humanism Justus Lipsius & Hugo Grotius

Based on practical reason (*etsi Deus not daretur*)

Today shared by believers and nonbelievers

Religion and ethics remained confined to the private realm

Scientism

It replaces ethical rationality by instrumental rationality

Valid if empirically verifiable Ethics is reduced to utilitarian calculation of maximum benefit

The Frankfurt School

very critical of Scientism

The Nazi Holocaust: a manifestation of the dark side of Modernity

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Habermas - Ratzinger

It is necessary some dialectic interaction between philosophy and religion in public Natural reason is not sufficient to grasp the depth of meaning of human existence

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Global ethics

Two groups:

Those who lay inter-religious dialogue as a foundation (R. Panikkar, H. Küng, L. Boff)
 Those who advocate for global ethics:

 a) Ontological foundation for ethics (H. Jonas, K. Jaspers, D. Henrich, V. Hösle)
 b) New anthropological and political formulation (E. Morin, W. Huber, H.-R. Reuter, E. Lévinas)

Interreligious dialogue

Küng: best response to the current daring challenges

Religions are the instances more capable of appealing to the man in all his dimensions (video) 1

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Dialogue is rooted in the very essence of God

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God's self-communication presupposes a personal recipient who can respond in freedom

All the official documents of the Second Vatican Council should be read from an ecumenical perspective

Vatican Chi dialogue a top priority

"An intrinsic requirement of the Christological event"

"we cannot truly call on God, the Father of all, if we refuse to treat in a brotherly way any man" (*NA 5)* 19

Religion wars: an expression of immaturity

The security of faith enables witness and dialogue with all The divine pedagogy respects the historical dimension of man and his gradual purification

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Nostra Actate: interreligious and intercultural dialogue

The Catholic Church has the "task of promoting unity and love

among men

"Among religions, there are points of contact, both internal and external"

Dialogue with the monotheistic religions (Islam and Judaism)

They share with Christians a common belief in father Abraham

> "Dialogue between Christians and Muslims is a vital necessity, on which in large measure our future depends"

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Interreligious dialogue: a constant concern of the post-conciliar Magisterium

Parliament of the se Vorles Roligions

It "does not originate from self-interest" It doesn't diminish the urgency of the mission 24

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"One is the community of all peoples, one their origin; One also is their final goal, God"

God has planted the Seeds of the Word in every human being 26

The world is watered by the Seeds of the Word

Christians are called to establish a "sincere and patient dialogue" with all peoples 27

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The Spirit of Assisi (video)

The Assisi meeting (1986) was very effective in showing that peace is a priority objective for all religions

Religions can play a key role in laying the foundations of peaceful coexistence in the globalized world

"Since wars begin in the minds of men, it is in the minds of men that the defenses of peace must be constructed"

"*Homo homini lupus"*

Conclusion

Religion (*re-ligare*) is devoted to build community

Through personal encounter, forgiveness and trustful relationship

> Man, "by its very nature, stands completely in need of social life" and should always be "the beginning, the subject and the goal of all social institutions" (GS 25)

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Religions have a long tradition of wisdom

Renowned worldwide for their devotion to helping vulnerable people Religions open humans to the contemplation of beauty

Even death becomes a sister... At that solemn moment we will be examined on love

Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace; (video) Where there is harved, let me sow love; Where there is injury, pardon; Where there is discerd, harmony; Where there is error, truth; Where there is doubt, faith; Where there is despair, hope; Where there is darkness, light; And where there is sadness, joy. O Divine Master, Grant that I may not so much seek To be consoled as to console; To be understood as to understand; To be loved as to love. For it is in giving that we receive; It is in pardoning that we are pardoned; And it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.
